

VIDEO SURVEILLANCE INFORMATION

The Shopping Centre area is monitored. The surveillance record may contain personal data.

- 1) Please be informed that on the premises of the Posnania Shopping Centre video surveillance is used to ensure the security of people and property. The surveillance monitoring covers: shopping arcades, technical corridors, elevators, staircases, parking lots, outdoor areas belonging to the Shopping Centre and parts of adjacent areas such as pavements or roads. Video cameras are placed mainly under the ceiling on passages, on internal walls of the building, on structural columns and under the ceiling on car parks, on the facade of the building and on the teletechnical column. This image may or may not contain personal data. Surveillance is carried out around the clock.
- 2) The area and rooms covered by video surveillance have been marked with signs with a camera icon and the inscription "Obszar monitorowany" (monitored area). The signs may be located on the entrance door to specific rooms.
- 3) The administrator of this monitoring system is Centrum Posnania Sp. z o.o. If the recording contains personal data, the administrator of this data is Centrum Posnania Sp. z o.o. contact details: Al. - 4) The processing of personal data from the images recorded by video surveillance cameras is carried out pursuant to Article 6(1)(f) of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), i.e. in the legally justified interest pursued by the controller consisting in the realization of the objective indicated in point 1 of the Information.
- 5) The recordings or personal data recorded thereon shall be made available *only to authorities or persons authorised under the law or, in justified cases, to persons registered by the video surveillance system or entities providing support under signed contracts of entrustment, providing assistance in the management of the building, protection of persons or property, or maintenance and repair of recording equipment.*
- 6) The recordings shall be kept for a period of 1 month from the date of recording. In case the recordings constitute evidence in legal proceedings

or the administrator is informed that they may constitute evidence in the proceedings, the period of storage of the recording shall be extended until such proceedings are concluded.

7) The subject of monitoring has the right to:

- access their personal data (art. 15 of the GDPR),
- correct or complete data, if they consider their personal data processed by the controller to be inaccurate (16 GDPR)
- request the deletion of personal data in the cases covered by law (Art. 17 GDPR),
- request restriction of the processing of personal data (18, GDPR),
- receive personal data in a structured format and to transfer personal data to another controller. In the case of data transfer, due to other legal regulations, it may be required to obtain the consent of the data subject or another person or to fulfil other conditions required by these regulations (art. 20 GDPR),
- object to the processing of their personal data in case it is processed for the legitimate interest of the controller, for reasons related to his/her specific situation, including profiling (art. 21 GDPR),
- file a complaint with the President of the Office for the Protection of Personal Data if she considers that the processing of their personal data violates the provisions of the GDPR.

Due to the special nature of processing personal data by means of image registration, not all of these rights may be exercisable, e.g. the right to rectify data.

8) Providing data is voluntary, however, it is necessary because of the nature of the monitoring system.

9) Personal data shall not be processed in a third country (outside the EEA).
